

BLACKOUT: No Milwaukee Mainstream Media Outlet Covers Archbishop Listecki's Condemnation Of Channel 4 Airing Of Last Supper Mockery During Olympics

As of this writing, all Milwaukee mainstream media outlets have refused to cover Milwaukee Catholic Archbishop Jerome Listecki's request that WTMJ-TV apologize for the airing of a mockery of The Last Supper during Friday's Olympics opening ceremony.

The Archbishop sent the request to TMJ4 General Manager Joe Poss. Normally, the media is all over demands for apologies from groups offended by something. But in this case, every local mainstream media outlet I checked had zero coverage of the Archbishop's letter to Channel 4.

Poss has not responded to my questions about the Archbishop's request for an apology. The Olympics opening ceremony has received widespread condemnation for a bizarre skit featuring trans women mocking The Last Supper and making a joke out of Jesus' lifting of the bread as depicted in the da Vinci painting. Poss responded by email to the Archbishop and acknowledged the request but refused to apologize.

I checked the websites of Channels 4, 6, 12 and 58 and found no coverage of the Archbishop's request for an apology. JSOnline also had nothing nor did The Business Journal or BizTimes. The story has been covered on WISN-AM, including on my program Monday. The only other coverage I found, other than from Catholic media, was an extensive story on the website of WTMJ-AM. WTMJ Radio and WTMJ-TV are under separate ownership and no longer affiliated with one another.

"This shocking blasphemy against the central moment in Christianity when, during the Last Supper Jesus gives his body and blood in anticipation of the cross, can not go without a proper response by the local television station that aired the scene and its network," Listecki wrote in his letter to Channel 4's Poss.

As of this writing, Listecki's request has been blacked out by the local media.

The Olympics opening ceremony had other Satanic images as well, including rapper Snoop Dogg wearing a medal sometimes associated with Satanism.
