

EXCLUSIVE: Repeat Milwaukee Felon Given Probation For Gun Crimes Involved In Shootout With Milwaukee Police

Milwaukee Police were involved in a shootout last evening (Tuesday July 9) near Teutonia and Locust with a convicted felon who was freed last year on probation by notoriously lenient Milwaukee County Circuit Judge Milton Childs.

Police are currently looking for the suspect, 28-year old Marc Parr, on charges of attempted homicide of a police officer.

Milwaukee Police sources tell me two detectives were investigating an unrelated crime when they saw a man, believed to be Parr, pointing a gun at another person. Parr fled, the detectives pursued and there was an exchange on gunfire.

Parr was convicted last year of multiple felonies including flee and eluding and being a felon in possession of a firearm. Childs sentenced Parr to several years in prison but stayed the sentence meaning he didn't have to serve it. Little more than a year later, Parr is being sought for allegedly being involved in a gunfight with police
